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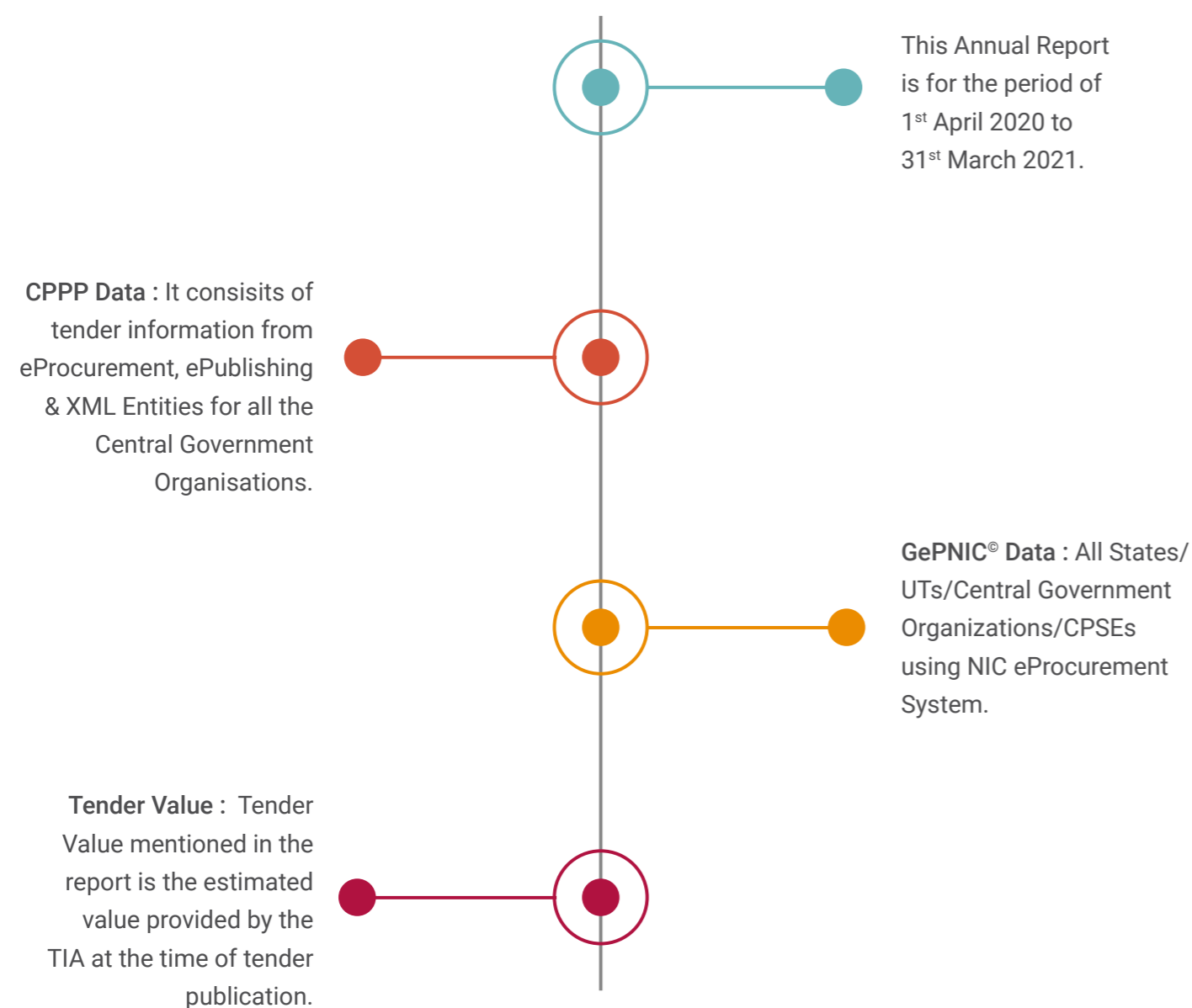

# About Central Public Procurement Portal

In pursuance of the recommendations of the Committee on Public Procurement headed by Shri Vinod Dhall and the decisions thereon of the Group of Ministers constituted to consider measures to tackle corruption and ensure transparency, the Department of Expenditure has taken action for setting up a Central Public Procurement Portal (CPP Portal in 2012). National Informatics Centre (NIC) has been given the responsibility for setting up this portal.

The primary objective of the portal is to provide a single point access to the information on procurements made across various Ministries and the line Departments. The CPP Portal is accessible at the URL <http://eprocure.gov.in> and it has e-publishing and e-procurement modules. It is mandatory for all Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government, Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and Autonomous and Statutory Bodies to publish all their tender enquiries in the CPPPP portal.

# Background

**National Informatics Centre (NIC)**, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology, in close association with **Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance** has developed, hosted and implemented the Central Public Procurement . The core engine behind the CPP Portal is the Government eProcurement system of NIC , GePNIC®.

The system is made available as a platform and can easily be adopted for all kinds of procurement such as Goods, Services & Works. It aims at transparency and non-discrimination amongst bidders, by allowing free access to tender documents, clarifications, secure online bid submission and access to bid opening event to all, from any place on 24x7 basis, using the system through Internet, in a faster, and secure environment adopting industry standard open technologies.

Variety of procurement requirements of varied procuring entities has been built in a robust configurable , workflow-based manner. This can be configured for use by an organization at its apex level, and at multiple subordinate levels, at which tenders could independently be floated.

Strong in-built security features including two-factor Authentication with Digital Signature Certificates (DSCs) for foreign nationals also as per IT Act, Usage of SSL, Role-based User Access and Bid-encryption at Client end, using PKI technologies. Security audited by as per EPS guidelines by STQC.

User base across the country by 30 State / Union Territories of India and by more than 614 Central Govt. entities. Processed 70.30 Lakh electronic tender's worth over Rs. 97.30 Lakh Cr. have been processed successfully till 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021.

# Purpose & Audience

This annual report on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) based on the usage in the year 2020-2021. The year when the world was grappling with COVID 19 Pandemic. The year when everyone witnessed unprecedentedly difficult times. No one had ever imagined that the invisible virus would have such a far stretched impact. In fact, no one, no walk of life was left untouched by the pandemic. As everyone did, we the CPPP team also put together everything possible to get back to routine functioning by equipping our team with all pre-requisites. We slowly started online interactions, extending remote support , handholding users and training them , clarifying doubts, fixing issues and so on by working from home.

The target audience of this report would be all users of Central Public Procurement Portal and other procurement officials or senior management involved in Government procurement. The purpose of the report is to showcase achievements of electronic procurement through CPP Portal across the country by various Central procuring entities, Autonomous Body and Public Sector Unit(s) in this testing times. The Annual reports provide information on statistical reports and history and summarize the State's statistics in the past year. It shows the trends of growth and other variations. Annual report highlights the achievement of States/UTs/ CPSEs who have shown tremendous performance as procuring entities. The enhancements made in the portal for benefit of users are also highlighted. It mentions the increase in User base and also volume of transactions handled by the system.

This report indicates and underlines the importance of use electronic systems for procurement specially in this era of Global pandemic. As the Central Public Procurement Portal was already widely adopted across India, it was much easier to sail through the lockdown and Work From Home era. In all, we can say that in spite of the disruption for major part of the year procurement worth Rs 17.3 Lakh Crores were accomplished with a cumulative fig of 12.6 Lakh tenders processed in the year April 2020 - Mar 2021 which is almost the same as previous year, if not higher.



# Lessons Learned & Major Challenges

**Mission :** Develop a secured and reliable end-to-end technological model to ensure not only fair, transparent and cost effective procurement processes, but also develop, maintain and continuously update a data analytics platform needed to support strategic decisions towards public expenditure reduction and optimization.

**It is believed that implementation of this will allow it to pursue its mission along three key strategic dimensions:**

# Journey so Far

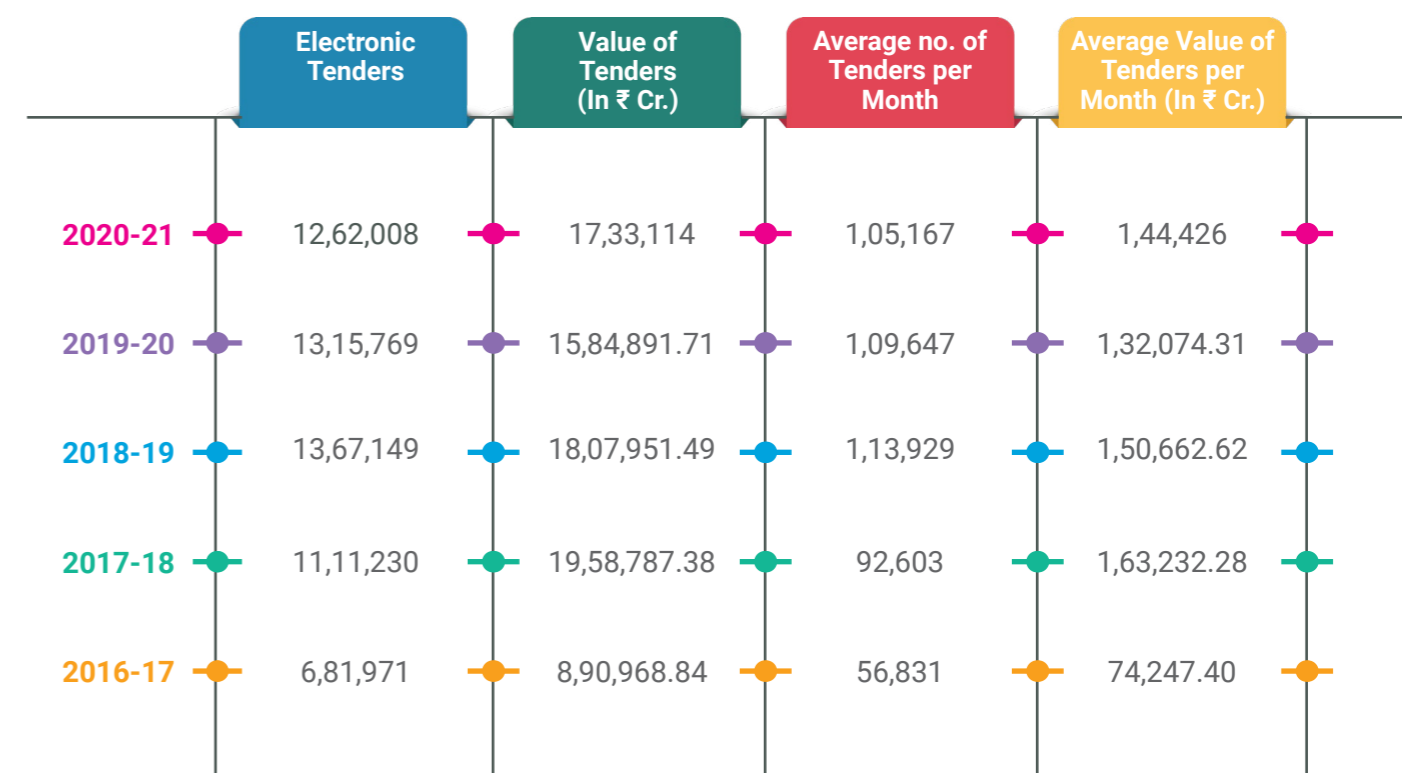
Central Public Procurement Portal was made operational on 1st January, 2012 by providing a two phased model for seamlessly bringing in all Central Government entities into electronic procurement ambit - ePublishing and eProcurement.

The seed for GePNIC® was sown way back in 2005-2006 when NIC wanted to adopt online tendering for its own requirements. We, at NIC have modest procurement requirements and process about 100+ tenders a year, predominantly of IT equipment and Services. But in a well thought move, in 2005, NIC planned to extend it to other procuring organizations. We experimented with readily available systems provided by third party by customising it to suit the requirements of government. However, this exercise couldn't be sustained. That's when we realized that if we need to serve various government departments, we would need to carve out a solution of our own i.e. we needed to be Atmanirbhar.

NIC took up the challenge to provide an eco-system which could emulate the complete existing procurement process without any compromise on procedures and practices followed, but by bringing in re-engineered process with more security, enhanced transparency and undoubted authenticity. Thus was born a generic e-Procurement software system, viz. Government eProcurement System of National Informatics Centre, GePNIC®. It was developed in house to cater to the procurement / tendering requirements of the Government departments and organizations. The system can easily be adopted for all kinds of procurement activities such as Goods, Services & Works.

From around 11,000 tenders worth Rs. 20,000 Crores per year in 2009-2010, GePNIC® graduated to process 12.6 Lakh tenders worth Rs. 17.3 Lakh crores per year in 2020-2021. CPP portal brought about phenomenal transformation by facilitating adoption of Online procurement across the country, wide and deep.

By issuing various guidelines and with constant monitoring, Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure has successfully on boarded majority of Central government procuring entities on to the portal. Multiple channels of Capacity Building, Easy availability of Digital Signature Certificates, Process re engineering as per need, inculcating the adoption of Best Practises across organisation, availability of uniform platform for ease of use and quick adoption in case of interdepartmental transfers etc were the steps taken which resulted in multifold increase growth over the last few years across the country.





# Central Public Procurement Portal

## As per Government Finance Rules (GFR 2017)

The Transparency Principle which is one of the fundamental principles of public procurement as per General Financial Rules, 2017 (Rule 144) states that 'all procuring entities should ensure that offers should be invited following a fair and transparent procedure and also ensure publication of all relevant information on the Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP).

Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) has been designed, developed and hosted by National Informatics Centre (NIC, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology) in association with Dept. of Expenditure to ensure transparency in the public procurement process. The primary objective of the Central Public Procurement portal is to provide a single point access to the information on procurements made across various Ministries and the Departments.

**E-Publishing (GFR - Rule 159)** : It is mandatory for all Ministries/Departments of the Central Government, their attached and Subordinate Offices and Autonomous /Statutory Bodies, to publish their tender enquiries (including advertised/limited/single tender enquiries), corrigenda thereon and details of bid awards on the Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP). E-Publishing has dispensed with print-advertisements in Newspaper etc.

**Exemption** : Individual cases where confidentiality is required, for reasons of national security, would be exempted from the mandatory e-publishing requirement. These instructions also would not apply to procurements made in terms of Purchase of goods without quotations/ Purchase of goods by purchase committee.

**E-Procurement (GFR - Rule 160)** : It is mandatory for Ministries/ Departments to receive all bids through e-procurement portals in respect of all procurements.

Ministries/ Departments which do not have a large volume of procurement or carry out procurements required only for day-to-day running of offices and also have not initiated e-procurement through any other solution provided so far, may use e-procurement solution (CPPP) developed by NIC. Other Ministries/ Departments may either use e-procurement solution developed by NIC or engage any other service provider following due process.

**Exemption** : In individual case where national security and strategic considerations demands confidentiality, Ministries/ Departments may exempt such cases from e-procurement. Also, Competent Authority may exempt in case of tenders floated by Indian Missions Abroad (global tender).

**Advertised /Open Tender Enquiry (GFR - Rule 161)** : Invitation to tenders by advertisement (open tender) should be given on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) at [www.eprocure.gov.in](http://www.eprocure.gov.in) and on GeM. An organisation having its own web site should also publish all its advertised tender enquiries on the web site. The Procuring Entity should also post the complete bidding document in its web site and on CPPP to enable prospective bidders to make use of the document by downloading from the website.

**Global Tender enquiry (GTE)** as per manual for procurement of goods 2017 is similar to OTE but, through appropriate advertising and provision for payment in Foreign Currencies through Letter of Credit, it is aimed at inviting the participation of inter-alia foreign firms. Advertisement in such cases should be given on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP)

**Limited Tender Enquiry (GFR - Rule 162)** : An organisation should publish its limited tender enquiries on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) as per Rule 159. Apart from CPPP, the organisations should publish the tender enquiries on Department's or Ministry's website.

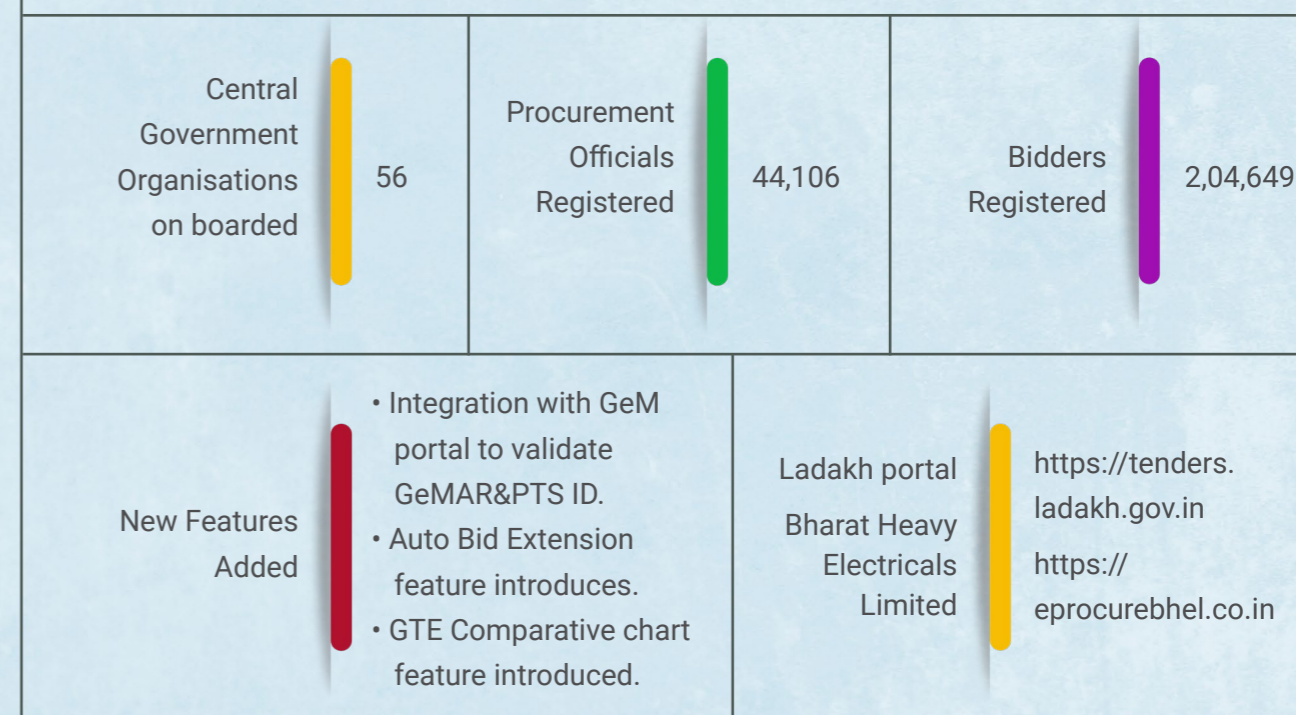
As per manual for procurement of goods 2017, certain items are procured only from Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) or manufacturers having proprietary rights (or their authorised dealers/ stockists) against a Proprietary Article certificate. Even in PAC procurements the NIT and the Award of Contract should be put on the website of CPPP and Procuring Entity.

**Transparency, competition, fairness and elimination of arbitrariness in the procurement process (GFR-Rule 173 (xviii))** : The name of the successful bidder awarded the contract should be mentioned in the CPPP, Ministries or Departments website and their notice board or bulletin.

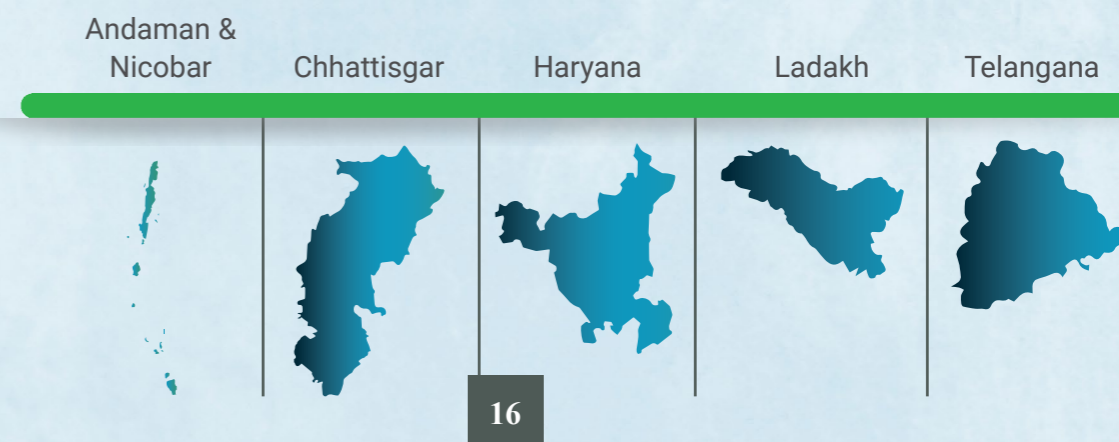
**Identification of likely sources for consulting services (GFR - Rule 183 ii)** : Where the estimated cost of the consulting services is above Rupees twenty-five lakhs, in addition to Rule 183 (i), an enquiry for seeking 'Expression of Interest' from consultants should be published on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) at [www.eprocure.gov.in](http://www.eprocure.gov.in) and on GeM. An organisation having its own website should also publish all its advertised tender enquiries on the website

**Registration of Suppliers (Rule 150)** : Registration (Simply registering the contractor, without any verification) - All the Ministries/Departments shall register the prospective contractors on their e-procurement portal or in the CPPP (in case they do not have their own e-procurement portal) before submitting their bids.

## New Feature Addition

- As MSME has adopted a new process for MSME Bidder registration i.e. UDYAM Registration; the same has been integrated with CPP Portal also through a webservice where the UDYAM number mentioned by the Bidder on CPP Portal would be verified and details of only valid UDYAM details will get saved.
- As per Office Memorandum No.F.6/18/2019-PPD issued by Dept of Expenditure, Min of Finance, it is mandatory for the buyer to generate GeM Availability Report and Past Transaction Summary (GeMAR&PTS) with a unique ID on GEM portal for any for any Goods and Services procurement outside GEM. Accordingly, NIC has integrated the CPP portal to validate the GeMAR&PTS ID generated in the GeM portal and is made available during tendering in that portal. A document wrt GeMAR&PTS ID generation for Goods/Services on GeM as well as its verification in CPPP (eprocurement portal) is available under Downloads section.
- Earlier, a functionality was available on CPP Portal named General Technical Evaluation (GTE) in which Tender Inviting Authority could evaluate the bidders online specifying their tender's General parameters with their expected values and comparing it with Bidders values during Technical Evaluation. Now, a new feature has been added to this functionality reg system generated Comparative chart on the basis of TIA's expected values and Bidders values, which would help the Evaluators in Evaluation.

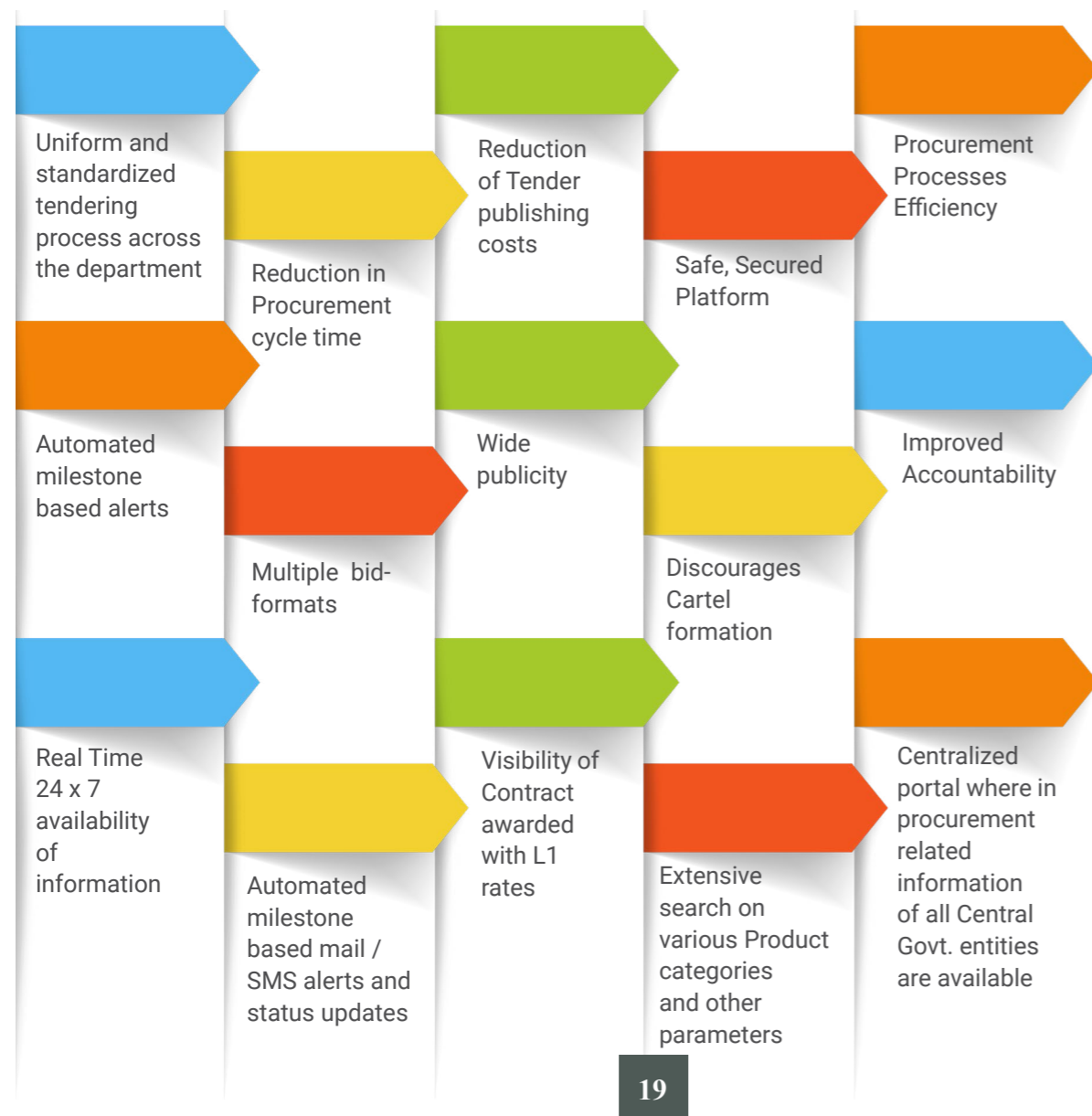

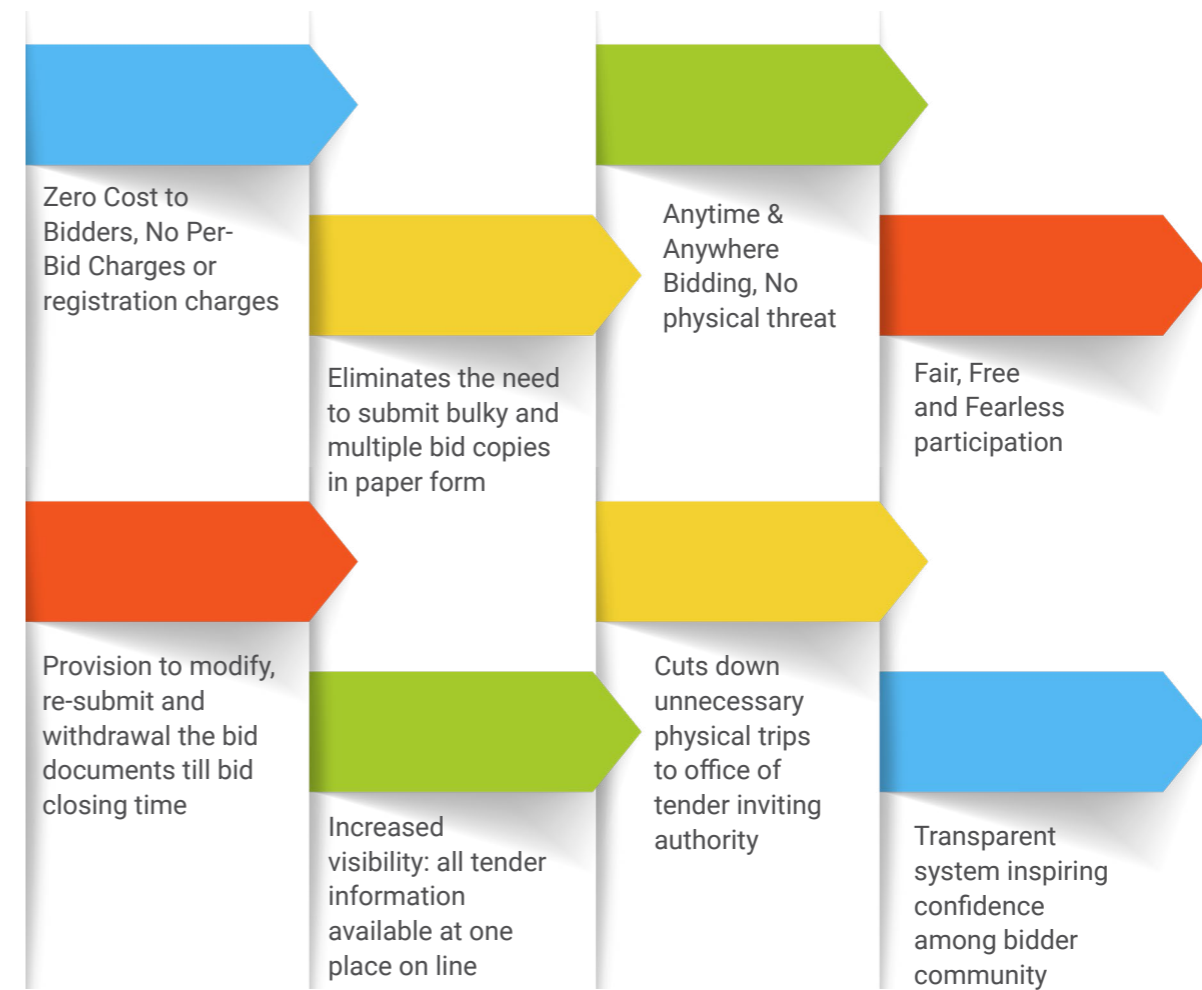

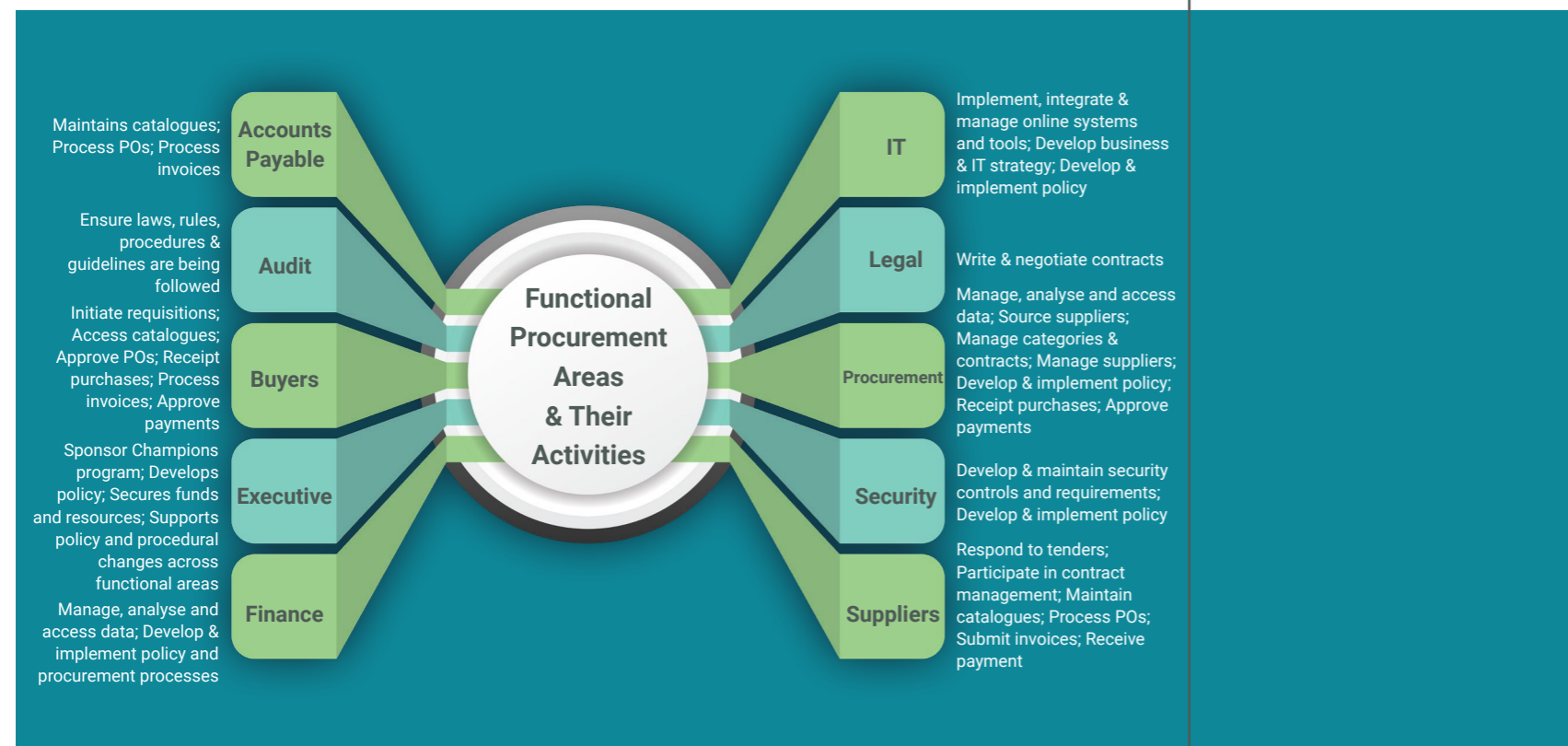


# Stakeholders

## In eProcurement System / Organizational Set-up

### Stakeholder identification

Stakeholders for e-procurement can include any person or functional area that “touches” the systems, tools or information being held. This may include people at all levels of the organisation and external contacts such as suppliers and outsourcing partners. The following list provides a general view of functional procurement areas and their potential e-procurement-related activities.



## Managing Stakeholders

When managing suppliers, it is important to demonstrate the benefits of e-procurement as their engagement is critical to success. Communicate what e-procurement can and cannot do followed - up with regular progress reporting and quantifiable metrics. These messages, form part of a strong Communications Plan and will help to keep key stakeholders informed and manage their expectations.

Getting stakeholders to participate can be difficult, especially if they do not understand the value of the implementation to themselves and their functional area. A successful model includes a cross - functional team with members from each functional area (see list detailed in Stakeholder Identification). The team can support testing, development and training activities along with acting as product champions.

Here are some examples of how well - managed stakeholders at different levels in the organisation can positively impact an e-procurement implementation :

**01**

Key stakeholders can spear head the change management activities by reviewing and updating local policy and procedures that will be impacted by the implementation.

**02**

The Executive Sponsor can ensure new policies and procedures are put into place to drive uptake of e-procurement.

**03**

End users prefer a fast and easy procurement process. Their roles and responsibilities often change as a result of e-procurement. Changes should be identified and communicated in a way that allows them to absorb the information and incorporate it into their work processes.

## Percentage share of Tender Category

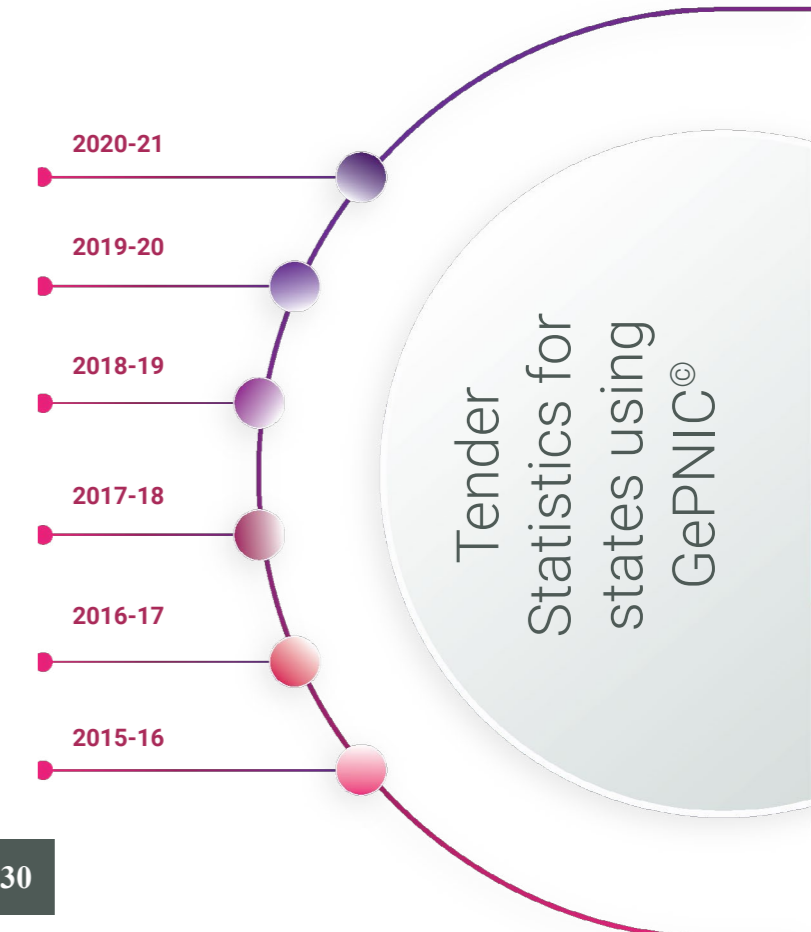

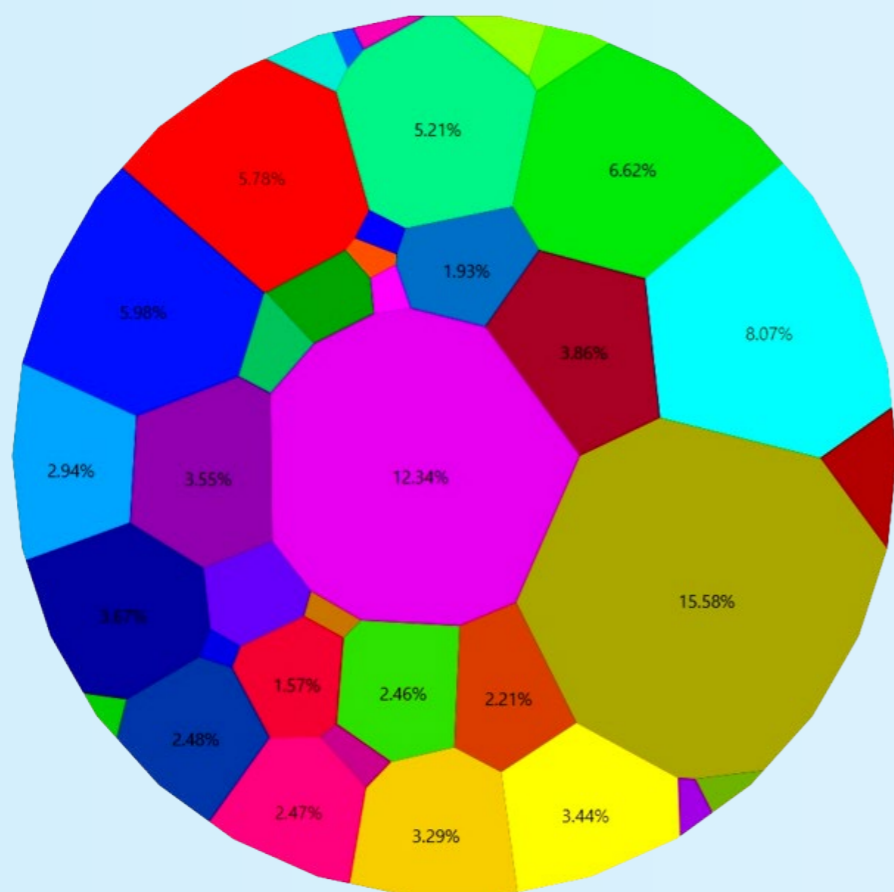

# Percentage Share of Procurement Spend of 30 States & UTs using GePNIC<sup>©</sup> (~ ₹ 17.3 Lakh Crores)



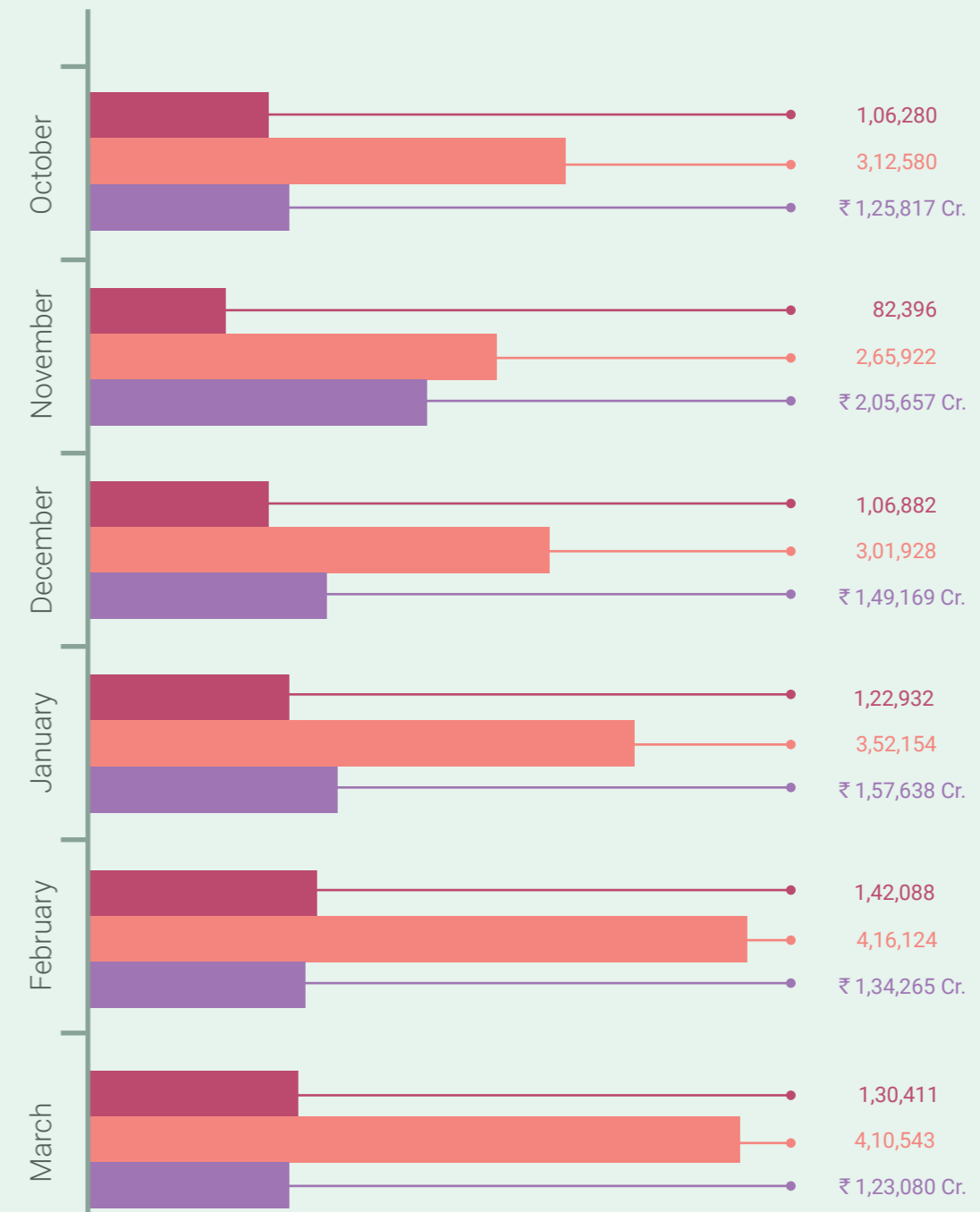


# Percentage of Bidders across India of 30 States & UTs using GePNIC® (~ 3.8 Lakh Bidders)

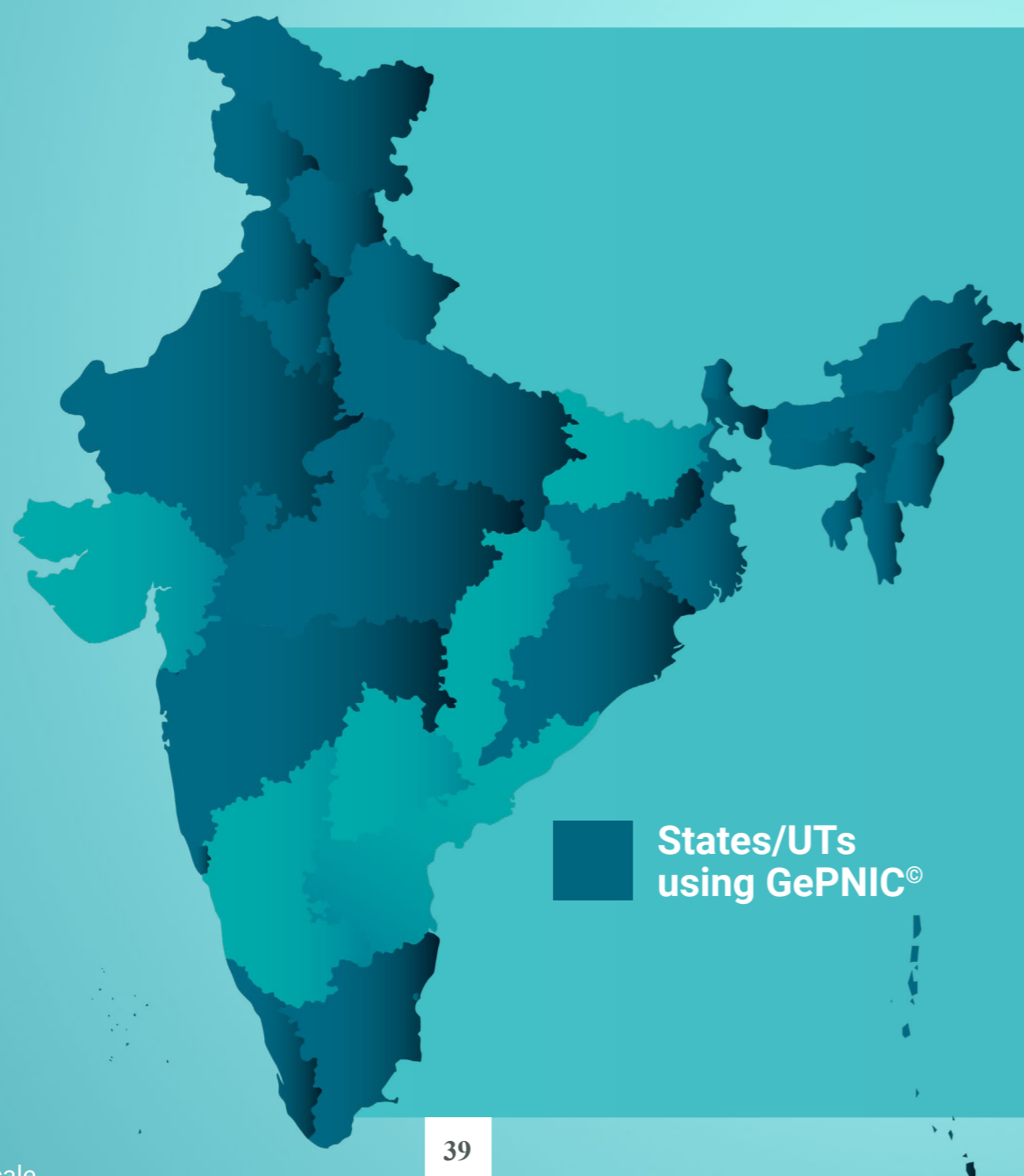

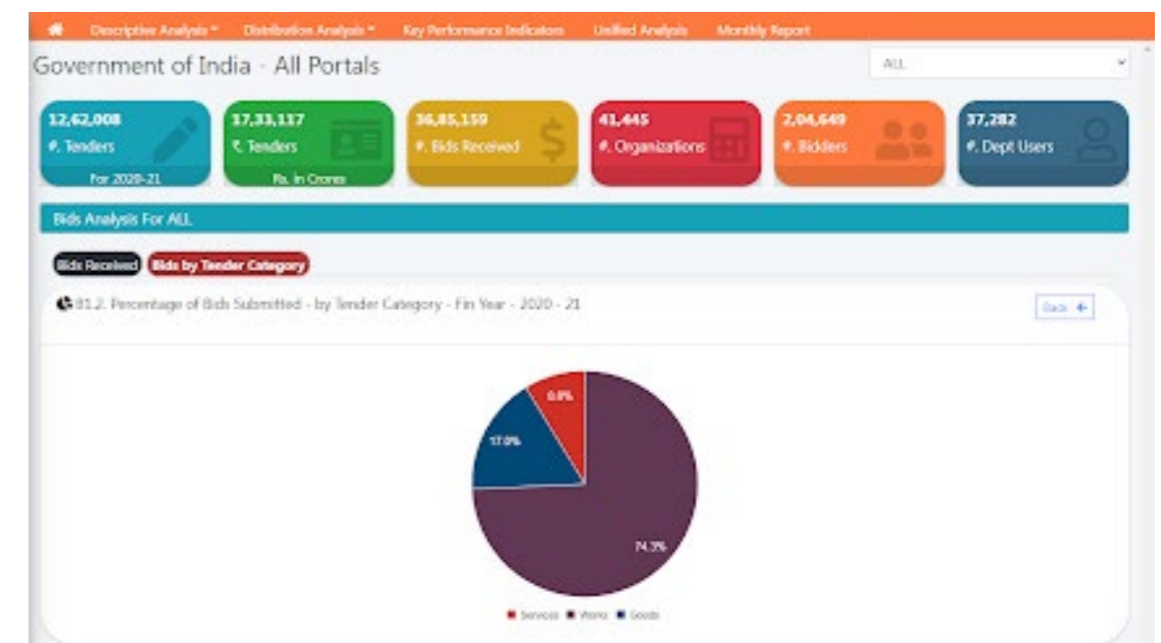
# Central Public Procurement Portal Dashboard

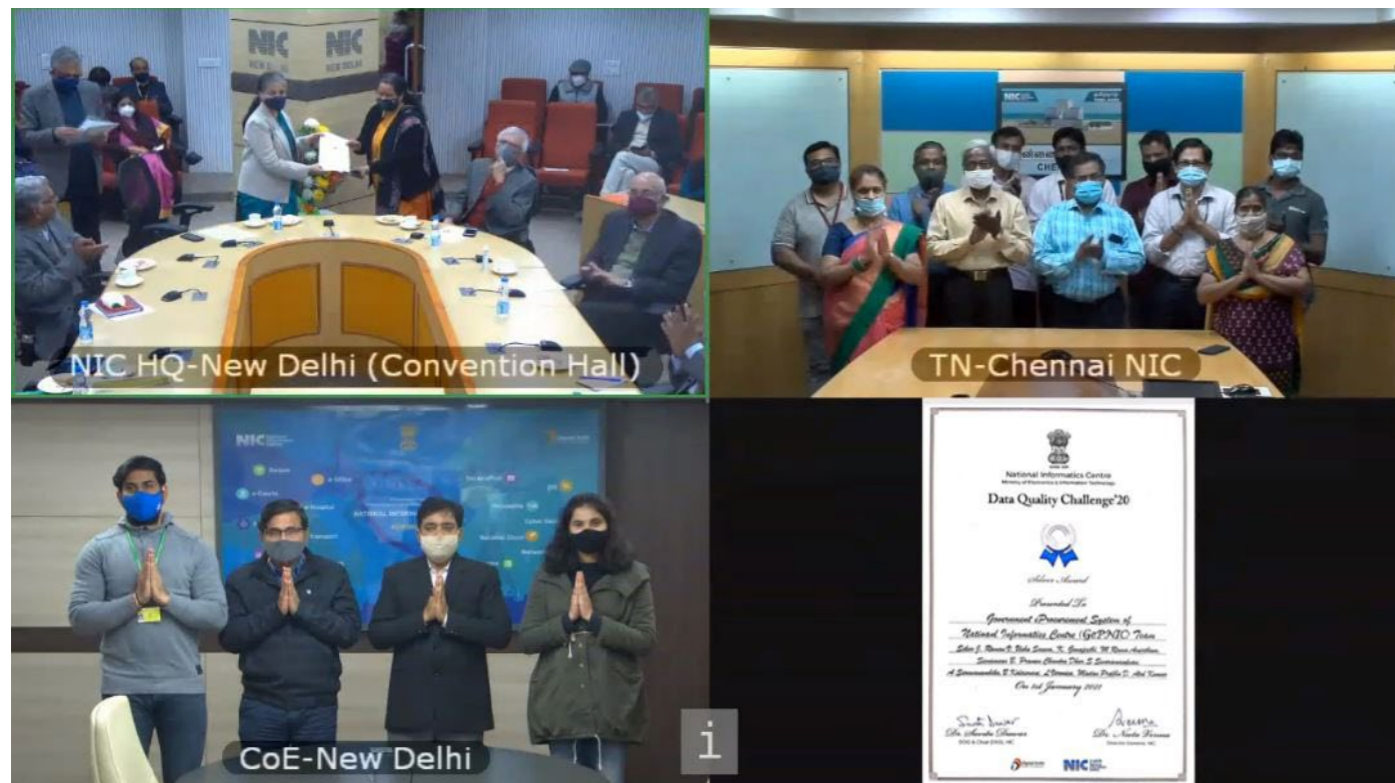
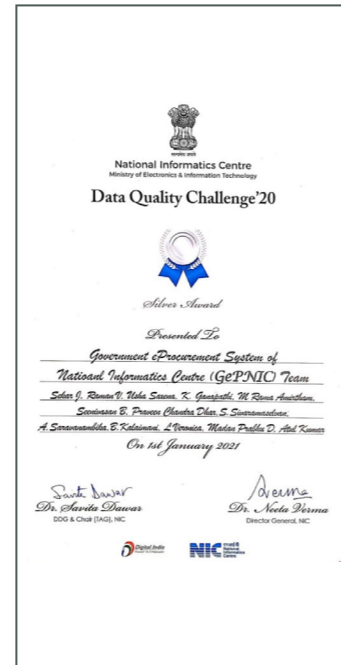




## GePNIC® Bags Data Quality Challenge Award 2020

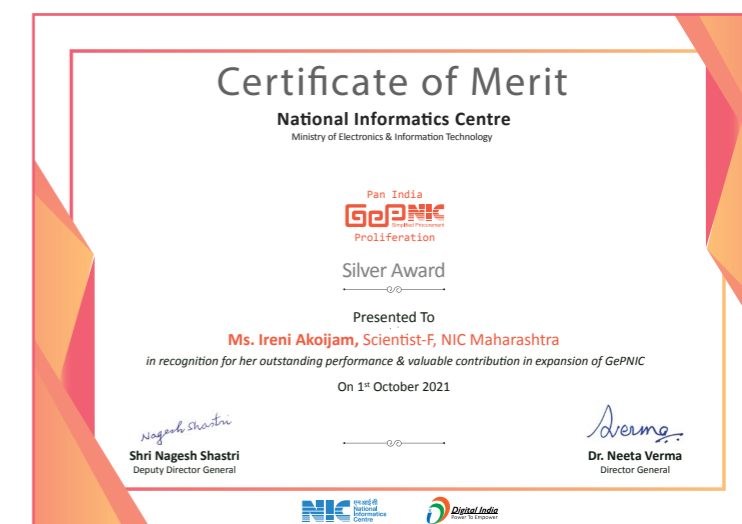
**Shri. N. Paul Varghese:** GePNIC® - Government E-procurement System of NIC under Mission Mode Project (MMP) - travelled a long way to re-write its success story since its inception as a pilot project under P&RD Department, Govt. West Bengal way back in 2012. GePNIC has been made mandatory through official notifications by Govt. of WB for its departments initially for a tender amount of Rs Fifty Lakhs and above and later the threshold limit was further lowered to Rs Five Lakhs – which itself bolster project’s acceptance and impact. The West Bengal team has facilitated further value addition such as Tender-cum-Auction, General Technical evaluation, Item-wise evaluation etc. through GePNIC® central team in the subsequent versions and the project acquired an enviable track record through increased efficiency. It is not out of place to mention that West Bengal is the second state in the country that has successfully implemented the Payment Gateway integration through ICICI Bank for collection of



Tenders Fees and Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) under GePNIC® application. All the offices of the Govt. Of West Bengal are presently using the GePNIC system to float and process their tenders.

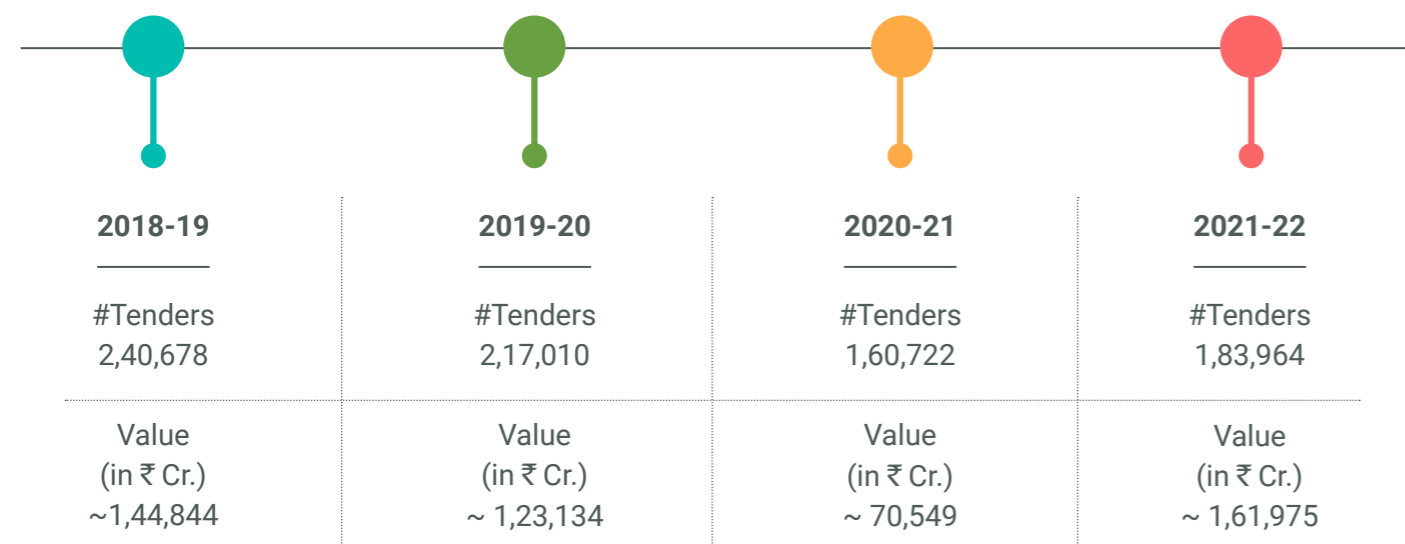
Earlier in 2018, Govt. of West Bengal was awarded the Best Performer award for E-Procurement in the States Procuring Entity Category at a function jointly organised by the Finance Department (Govt. of India) and National Informatics Centre at New Delhi.

**Ms. Ireni Akoijam :** The Maharashtra eProcurement System of NIC (URL: <https://mahatenders.gov.in>) has been successfully running across the state since 14<sup>th</sup> Dec 2011. NIC initiated the project with the help of DIT, Govt. of Maharashtra and brought transparency in the tendering system which resulted in much reduced tender life cycle. Various Government Resolutions were issued for reducing the tender threshold value from Rs. 50 lakhs initially to Rs. 3 lakhs in the year 2012. A team of 50 technical manpower were deployed to provide training to all Government offices throughout Maharashtra which helped adoption of the system very fast and help penetration of the project reach the villages of Maharashtra. Even the Gram Panchayats started using the system for tender value as low as Rs. 10 thousand only. In the year 2014, Maharashtra became the first state in the country to integrate online payment of Tender Fee and EMD with automatic refund through State Bank of India Multiple options payment system (SBMOPS). Subsequently, the online payment model got replicated in other states. Till date, total 12,92,893 tenders have been published on mahatenders.gov.in worth tender value Rs.7,79,80,250/- lakhs only. Total 369 Government Organisations are registered on GePNIC® with 1,36,155 registered Government users and 2,37,4343 registered bidders.

**Awards:** Received Best G2B Initiative Award in 2013 (Mumbai), Best Performance Award in 2018 (New Delhi) and Silver Award for Product Proliferation in 2021 (NIC, New Delhi).

By the time we started to on board user departments in GePNIC®, the Covid19 pandemic hit the world and it made our job of implementation more difficult. Despite the pandemic, we managed to onboard departments and users by engaging in a one to one basis. We provided technical guidance to familiarize the users with GePNIC and did trouble shooting to resolve technical issues using remote desktop tools for not so tech savvy users. This required us work on holidays and weekends to provide necessary handholding support to Govt dept users. With continuous engagement we managed to enrol most of the user departments in GePNIC®. By the time Covid spread receded from its peak level, we had successfully completed onboarding of all tendering departments and most of the departments had published and processed their tenders in GePNIC®. Some of the departments have even published and processed sophisticated forms of tenders such as QCBS, Tender-cum-auction in addition to normal form of contracts.

As of now, 43 departments/offices with over 5,000 worth more than 4,100 crores has been processed. In addition to the above, offices of Deputy Commissioner South Andaman district and Deputy Commissioner North and Middle Andaman district have used the eAuction portal of NIC in the last 2 years for auction of stone quarry mines.

Now the GePNIC® system is going stable and is being used by departments of A&N Administration for all needs of tendering works.

**Shri. Sendil Kumar :** The Andaman and Nicobar Islands are a group of 572 Islands out of these islands, around 37 islands are inhabited by people and the rest of the islands are under forest cover. Given the geographical remoteness of these islands and absolute lack of public internet infrastructure it was very difficult to imagine implementing any eGovernance system. Further, there was a huge digital divide between Port Blair in South Andaman and rest of A&N islands as the telecommunication and internet infrastructure was not uniform among different islands with some remote islands totally outside mobile phone connectivity. A&N Administration had opted to use a third party eProcurement system by deploying the same in its local State Data Centre. However looking into successful use of GePNIC® across India, A&N Administration decided to switch over to GePNIC® in February 2020 and made it compulsory for all departments to publish all their tenders online.



# Support during Pandemic Period

The year 2020-2021 will always be remembered as COVID 19 pandemic year. The year when mankind witnessed the unprecedented, went thru various hardships and still managed to come out strong and unified. This year witnessed many short duration tenders to meet the emergency situation. The GFR already has provisions to meet such kind of situations:

Publishing of Tender information in newspaper and ITJ is more mandatory. **Advertisement should be on Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP) and GeM.**

Rule 161 (v) Advertised Tender Enquiry : Ordinarily bid submission be three weeks from bid publication date and four weeks for Global Tenders. **However, for emergency procurement, the bid submission deadline can be lesser.**

Rule 162 (iii) (a) Limited Tender Enquiry method be used for tenders valuing up to Rs 25 lakh, **however it may be adopted even for procurements > Rs. 25 lakhs. CA to certify the urgency of demand and record the nature of urgency.**

## How the team geared upto support during COVID 19 pandemic

We have tender inviting organisations across India. In order to provide extensive timely support, we have 24x7x365 days telephonic helpdesk, one support personnel in headquarters of each state and UT, a centralised PMU team placed in NIC Delhi, a technical support team at NIC Chennai, a 24 x7x365 team to ensure proper server response and functioning.

These team members have always been on call, supporting online during the COVID 19 pandemic period. Procurement processed during this time varied from construction, maintenance, tender for services, procurement of medical equipment, medicines etc. Huge number of COVID 19 health centre, hospital with beds was set up for emergency care across the country. Setting up of ICUs, make shift Beds, Including Supply, Installation, Commissioning and Maintenance of Equipment as part of COVID-19 Emergency Response were most common tenders. These tenders were completed in a very short time ranging from a week to a month.

(i) It is decided to reduce Performance Security from existing 5-10% to 3% of the value of the contracts for all tenders issued/concluded till 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021.

(ii) No provisions regarding Bid Security also known as Earnest Money Deposit should be kept in the Bid Documents in future and only provision for Bid Security Declaration should be kept in the Bid Documents for all tenders issued till 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021.

- Various Provisions were made in GFR, 2017 which were applicable for Emergency Procurement

# Conclusion

National Informatics Centre in association with Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure, Min of Finance have put up the Central Public procurement portal. CPP Portal is an assimilation of all procurement information across the country in one place. This is driven by Government eProcurement system of NIC GePNIC<sup>®</sup> which is used by 30 States /UTs and 614 Central Government organisations across the country.

In this financial year 2020-2021 all of us had to re-orient ourselves to extend seamless service during unprecedented pandemic period as well. Within a short time everyone in our team was well equipped to meet user requirements cross the country which was very well appreciated by all. In our efforts to keep continuously improving the GePNIC<sup>®</sup> platform many new features were added which has been enumerated in this report and there were many new user organisations joined us.

CPP portal hosts all the Office Memorandums / Office orders / Policy / Guidelines / Procurement Manuals / CVC guidelines related to procurement, thus making it a one stop shop for any procurement related information.

The average tenders processed per month is around 1 lakh worth Rs 1.4 Lakhs crores in this financial year. The overall tenders for 2020-21 is 12,62,008 worth Rs 17,33,113.55 Crore and the total procurement carried out since inception is 70,30,684 tenders worth Rs 97,30,828.99 Crore. There is a foot fall of 3,80,000 Vendors / Suppliers 3,70,264 Procuring entities across the country for this platform.

There were three awards this year – first being the NIC Data Challenge Award . There were two CSI awards also. Such recognitions infuse lot of encouragement and enthusiasm in our team aspiring to deliver better.







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
